HeadStart Action is a geographically and demographically focused personal and social development programme targeted at young people who are at risk of becoming NEET and require greater support to be in education, employment or training. Through social action, the programme supports young people to gain employability skills, aid their personal development and gain work experience.

The programme was designed and piloted in 2018 by The Challenge in partnership with The Mayor of London and Lendlease in Southwark, before being grown into four further areas of London through the first round of the Mayor of London's Young Londoners Fund in 2018-2019 before being transferred to London Youth for round two.

Domestic abuse calls to the Metropolitan Police increased by 11.4% during lockdown

Domestic Abuse is one of a key number of Adverse Childhood Experience (ACEs) which indicate a greater propensity for a young person to struggle in teenage and adult years. ACEs have a strong correlation with a young person being criminally exploited or becoming a victim or perpetrator of violence.

Nearly 40% of London's children are living in households in poverty

Children most likely to experience poverty include those in single parent households, those in Black and Asian households, with the highest rates by far among children from Pakistani and Bangladeshi households, and in households where someone is disabled.


